


Our new topic is: Plants- Growing Things

What is Growing Outside?



LO: To identify and examine a variety of plants and local plants.

Success Criteria:

Identify, examine and draw a range of fruits and vegetables that could be grown locally or in our garden.

Understand where they can be grown

Observe and ask questions.

Today, we are going to be observing some fruits and vegetables.


Lets look really closely at the different fruits and vegetables we have in front of us, how can we describe them:

- What sort of plant does this grown on?
- What can you see?
- How does it feel?
- Does it have and lumps or bumps?
- Is it smooth or rough?
- Are they fully grown? How do you know?
- Do you know which ones can be grown locally?

You can even cut open the fruit or vegetable for a closer look inside!

Task: examining and drawing a range of fruit and vegetables

In your books, you are going to be drawing one or two fruits and vegetables close up.

Use the observations you have just made about what the fruit and vegetables look like close up to help you. What do you notice?

You could also examine them through touch and taste and then sketch the plant they come from.
