Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to the final Newsletter of 2021.

We have had a successful term in spite of all the health issues we have faced. I thought I would take this opportunity to look back at some of our achievements this term. In September we were delighted to welcome a bumper number of grandparents to our celebration of their role. It was so successful we had to use both the Parish Hall and the School Hall to accommodate everyone! The children read their memories and prayers beautifully and the grandparents were provided with tea and cake.

We also welcomed our new Early Years children in September and they have settled in very quickly. I was very impressed by their singing and dancing in the Nativity this year and their growing confidence. Because we only have 33 pupils in Early Years the children are benefiting from more individual attention and their skills and independence and developing rapidly. Many parents have commented how much they enjoy sharing in the learning via the Tapestry app and we will continue to use this in 2022.

At the beginning of October we were visited by Diocesan inspectors who evaluated our RE teaching, worship and Catholic life. Having looked through books, observed lessons, spoken to governors, parents and children they declared that St Mary's provided an outstanding Catholic education for the children. We were delighted with the outcome and will continue to make sure that the Catholic ethos remains at the heart of our school. In the same month our Year 6 children managed to visit PGL for some outdoor adventurous activities. They grew in confidence and resilience and impressed all the adults with their behaviour and thoughtfulness.

The Families and Staff Association (FSA) pulled out all the stops this year to ensure the children had some wonderful events to enjoy and money was raised for the school in the process. The discos were very popular and the pop-up shops and Christmas raffle gave the children the opportunity to experience the Christmas spirit without a formal fair. Our huge gratitude goes to all those involved including our wonderful office team here in school.

We are already planning ahead for the spring term and will be launching a new phonics strategy for Early Years and key stage 1 in the New Year so watch this space! In the meantime I hope you and your family have a fantastic Christmas and New Year.
