Dear Parents and Carers

A belated welcome back after the Easter break and bank holiday – I hope you enjoyed the spring-like weather and were able to find some time to relax.

The Curriculum Newsletters will soon be with you detailing all of the activities for the summer term. The phases have started their new topics with a stunning start and we are making the most of this short half term. The topics this term are as follows: KS1 – Beneath the Sea; LKS2 – The Rainforest; UKS2 – Saxons and Vikings. Our Chair of Governors, Tony Lucas, led an archaeological dig for Years 5 and 6 so they could experience searching for historical evidence. The children's imaginations were fired and they were able to unearth some remains of 'The Den' which was a large house underneath the school field. It was a large house built by the Earl of Strathmore (Bowes-Lyon) in the 1860s and was demolished in the 1940s. The children found roof tiles, remains of foundations and some pottery on site and were keen to find out more.

We are also very proud of our Year 3 and 4 children who performed their passion play, Here Comes Jesus, beautifully this week. We had two sell-out crowds and it was fantastic to have parents back inside the building to share our celebration of Easter. The children sang, danced and acted beautifully and told the Easter story in a memorable and thoughtful way. My thanks goes to the staff teams in Marine, Blake and Craigweil for their hard work. Wheatland Class led our *Mass of the Risen Christ* last Friday and the children filled Our Lady of Sorrows church with their prayers and singing. It was a lovely way to start what promises to be a very busy and interesting term!

St Mary's was also represented at the *Big Sing* this week which was held at the Regis School. Mrs Morreale led our choir and they performed beautifully. Years 1 and 2 enjoyed a visit from the Fire Service last week and were able to see a fire engine up close as well as meet some real life fire-fighters. Many of the children told me afterwards that they would like to be fire-fighters when they were older and they were very thankful for our hardworking local crews. Early Years had their chance to meet the crew this week and were similarly delighted. Mr Robinson, our Premises Officer, has also been hard at work on the field over the holidays. He has constructed a raised flower bed in the shape of a cross as designed by our School and RE Councils. We have been provided with top soil, timber and seeds by a generous parent and Wickes in Bognor so we are really looking forward to planting and nurturing our new Spiritual garden.

The coming week will be very busy in school with our Year 6 children taking their Sats tests. This is the first time the tests have taken place since 2019 so the children have asked plenty of questions about the days ahead. Our *Families and Staff Association* have kindly agreed to provide breakfast for the children next week to give them a head start before their tests. As usual, the tests are kept strictly under lock and key until one hour before each test so we will have to wait and see what lies ahead. The children have prepared well and we know they will do their best but please keep them in your prayers!
