Dear Parents and Carers

It has been lovely seeing the improvement in the weather over this week - long may it continue!

The May Procession today was very moving. The church was filled with flowers and the children sang beautifully. The children understand that May is the month of Mary and we have been running Rosary Prayer groups throughout this month for both key stage 1 and 2. We wish them every success and are very grateful for the FSA's time and hard work in setting up the breakfast. We had a meeting of the Governing Body on Monday evening. They are aiming to produce an *Annual Report* which should be with you by the time you receive your child's report in July. The governors will be in school on Tuesday talking to children about their learning and getting to know the new topics this term.

THE DESIGNATED SAFEGUARDING LEADS AT ST MARY'S

Mr Edgington and Mrs Beaven are Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs). The designated safeguarding lead is the person appointed to take lead responsibility for child protection issues in school. All schools must have a designated safeguarding lead in place to deal with child protection concerns. Our role includes ensuring that safeguarding is at the heart of the school ethos and that all staff are supported in knowing how to recognise and respond to potential concerns. We also liaise with staff on matters of safety and safeguarding and when deciding whether to make a referral by liaising with relevant agencies and act as a source of support, advice and expertise for staff.

As part of our role we sometimes have to refer cases of suspected abuse to Children's Social Care, and support staff who have raised concerns about a child or have made a referral to Children's Social Care. Where there are concerns about radicalisation, we make referrals to the Channel programme and offer support to other staff who have concerns about radicalisation. To keep children safe we detailed, accurate and secure records of concerns and referrals. We also work with the governing body to ensure the school's child protection policy is updated and renewed annually and that all members of staff have access to it and understand it. All our policies are on our website and we encourage you to read our schools Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy.

West Sussex Early Help Services

Have you heard of Early Help?

The Early Help team are able to support families with a range of difficulties by providing advice and signposting to local services. Sometimes, an Early Help Plan may be put together for you by the professionals supporting you. This makes it easier to know what needs to happen and you can also see how much progress you are making.

You and your family work together with Early Help so that you can make positive changes to your life and your circumstances, helping you to be the best that you can.

They can give you help with sorting out any problems, with agreed actions and lots of help to achieve them, and help coordinating the different services you receive.

They can help you to:

- sort debt and housing problems
- talk with different services
- look for work
- reduce family rows
- tackle problems at school
- build your confidence
- find voluntary work and hobbies
- resolve worries about your children

Your Early Help plan will explain what's happening for you and has agreed actions. It gives information about support and explains how you will make changes for yourself. You and your family write the plan and a named worker will give you practical support and encouragement alongside school and any other services that you work with.
